Dear brothers and sisters:

Moved by the deep experience of the love that the Father has for each one of us, by whom we feel immensely loved and called to participate in his plan, we are preparing ourselves to celebrate the feast of S. Anthony Claret.

For the Lay Claretians Claret is a gift of God that leads us to commit ourselves to discern our own way of following Jesus.

A tireless missionary who used manifold means to evangelize, Claret urges us to be creative in our effort to reach all the corners of the world.

Claret, for his devotion to the Heart of Maryt, urges us to look at Her as Mother, Master and Guide.

For the confidence that he always had in the laity and for his prophetic vision that considered the laity as active members of his apostolic plans, Claret impels us to take on the responsibly of our mission in the world in which we live.

The feast of St. Anthony Mary Claret brings together all the members of the Claretian Family and challenges them to walk side by side in the carrying out of their mission as evangelizers, each one according to his or her specific vocation. We Lay Claretians must do it according to our condition as laypersons trying to be salt and light in our families and places of work. We must be signs of hope, and become persons and communities who are able to go against the stream because we are driven by the Spirit of Lord. The Lay Claretian Sourcebook defines the mission of the Church as a call "to proclaim and spread Kingdom of God, that is to announce the salvation in Jesus Christ and bring others to encounter Him, to help the seed of the Kingdom develop in the world, so as to renew the human race and create a new humanity in conformity with the newness of the Gospel". Our mission is to contribute "heart", "tenderness" and "hope" in the struggle for justice, peace and respect for the dignity of human beings.

God makes to us another gift for which we must be happy: the celebration of the next General Assembly that will take place in Vic (Barcelona, Spain). This time our Assembly will provide to us an opportunity to visit the places where St. Anthony Claret was born, lived, carried out his mission and prayed. We will pray and celebrate the Eucharist before his tomb, and we will embrace each other in a fraternal gathering as a loving family who wants to keep herself committed to her task of evangelization with courage and hope.

#### **Rules for participation:**

With right to voice and vote
The members of the General Council
1 delegate from each Regional Council
1 delegate from each admitted group, or 2 if the group is constituted by more than
20 members
With right to voice and without vote
The regional advisors and advisors of groups without region
As invited(\*)
1 delegate from groups in discernment
1 CMF or RMI from each country where the Movement is beginning: Canada, Philipines, India, Equatorial Guinea, Sao Tomé, USA, Mexico, Panama, Portugal.

(\*) Due to problems of capacity of the place where the Assembly will be held, the Lay Claretians in discernment and the CMF/RMI who want to participate as invited persons, shall request it to the General Council. Likewise, the application form of the Lay Claretians in discernment has to be guaranteed by the signature of the respective coordination team. Such request shall be send to Cristina Martinez, General Secretary of the LCM by December 31st, 2002.

If some admitted group cannot send a member to the General Assembly, it may delegate its vote to another admitted Lay Claretian, according to what is established in the rules for the application of the Statutes nn. 18.1, 18.2, 18.3.

To facilitate the task, we suggest that the Regional Councils collect the information of their own Regions: Delegates of the admitted groups; Delegates of the groups in discernment, Delegates of their own Regional Council and its Religious Assessor, and send it to the General Secretariat.<sup>1</sup>

**Reports of the Region or Groups without region:** To help the Regional Councils and the groups without Region to write the Report that they must present to the General Assembly, we suggest several points to be included in it:

- Statistics of the region: up to date lists of each group.
- Assemblies celebrated during the last 4 years: themes, resolutions that were approved; most important decisions, etc.
- Events that the Region would like to underline.
- Promotion of the Movement: initiatives carried out for that purpose.
- Relation with other groups of the Claretian Family.
- Publication of the Regional Bulletin and other publications.
- Economic situation of the Region: means for self-funding and collaboration to the general economy of the Movement.

# You are kindly requested to send the report by January 15, 2003, to the General Secretariat, att. Cristina Martínez.

**Theme of the Assembly:** *"The mission of the Lay Claretian at the present moment"*. Aurora Bailón, General coordinator of Formation of the Lay Claretian Movement, will take care to coordinate the preparation of the theme. The groups that have not done it yet, should send their answers to the questionnaire that was published in the Bulletin of the Lay Claretian Movement n. 80, and in the letter of Cristina Martinez of March 7, 2002.

**Prayer for the Assembly:** From right now we shall begin to be preparing ourselves for the next Assembly. For that we invite you to pray so that the Vic Assembly becomes an encouragement for us to be faithful to our mission.

# **NEWS FROM THE REGIONS**

I take advantage of this letter to inform you about the some important events or plans of different Regions:

The Lay Claretians of Italy got together in Saint Giovanni Rotondo (Foggia) from July 3 to 6. The formation theme of their IX Assembly was "The laity committed to a shared mission".

The Lay Claretians of the Caribbean Region celebrated their II Assembly in the Fusimanya Spirituality House, at Puerto Plata, Santo Domingo, from August 30 to September 2. The theme of the Assembly "A Baptism of Christian Spirituality".

The Lay Claretians of the Betica Region (Spain) will have their VIII Regional Assembly from November 1 to 3. The central theme will deal with "The mission of the Lay Claretian".

Likewise, the Lay Claretians of the Northern Region of Spain will get together at Zaragoza, from November 8 to 10, to celebrate their VIII Regional Assembly. Theme: "The mission of the Lay Claretian".

The Lay Claretians of Brasil-Paraguay have had a formative meeting at the regional level, from April 20 to 21. Likewise the Lay Claretians of Venezuela have planned a meeting for next October, and those of Colombia will have it on November.
